“Recommending Decent Work Agenda as a Brand Name for the Aquino Administration’s Labor and Employment Reforms Towards Inclusive Growth, Decent and Productive Work and Competitive Enterprises”

WHEREAS, the 22-Point Platform and Policy Pronouncements on Labor and Employment lay down the overarching goal, thrusts and directions for the Aquino Administration in terms of focusing programs and interventions aimed at empowering the Filipino human resource;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Development Plan (PDP) 2011-2016 provides the strategic policy framework for the medium-term and contains the current reforms in labor and employment which is primarily conceived from the principles of inclusive growth and poverty reduction;

WHEREAS, the aforementioned guiding principles were the frameworks utilized for the multi-stakeholders’ Philippine Labor and Employment Plan (LEP) 2011-2016 with the goal of attaining “Inclusive Growth through Decent and Productive Work and Competitive Enterprises”;

WHEREAS, for purposes of advocacy and better recollection by the social partners and the general public, it may be beneficial to come up with a brand name that will reflect the priorities and thrusts of the Aquino administration;

WHEREAS, during the TIPC Plenary Meeting on 25 October 2011, the tripartite partners agreed to embrace the “Decent Work Agenda” as a catch phrase to indicate and encapsulate the principles, ideas and aspirations of the President’s Labor and Employment Reforms;



WHEREAS, the LEP acknowledges the significance of Decent Work as the basic organizing element in designing policy and program interventions that will help advance the goal of inclusive growth.


