

Dependents of Displaced Workers of Tmpcwa Avail of WODP Scholarship



Six (6) dependents of displaced union officers/members of Toyota Motor Philippines Corporation Workers Association (TmPCWA) availed of the Isabelo delos Reyes (IDR) Scholarship under the Workers' Organization Development Program (WODP) of DOLE-Bureau of Labor Relations (BLR).

The scholars (one incoming 3rd Year and five incoming college freshmen) together with their parents, who were among the 233 dismissed employees of Toyota Motor Philippines in Parañaque, were oriented on the WODP Scholarship Grants on 14 September 2018 at the BLR Conference Room in Intramuros, Manila.

Ms. Marivic Villa, Chief of the BLR Union Registration and Workers Empowerment Division, discussed the WODP Guidelines and the Terms and Conditions of IDR Scholarship.

Freshmen scholars were enrolled in the National University of the Philippines, Calamba Doctor's College, Technological University of the Philippines, City College of Calamba, and Polytechnic University of the Philippines taking up Business Administration, Hotel and Restaurant Management, Entrepreneurial Management, Education, and Information Technology. The third year scholar was enrolled in Colegio de San Juan de Letran-Calamba taking up Mechanical Engineering.

The WODP is envisioned to enhance the leadership capabilities and potentials of workers and their organization toward a pro-active and dynamic role in national development.

The scholarship grant is extended to qualified dependents of officers and members of legitimate labor organizations and workers organizations under the IDR Scholarship Grant which endeavors to help them by way of backing their children's educational needs. It is granted upon submission of complete requirements which includes application form, profile of scholar, picture, ITR of parent, birth certificate, report card, certificate of good health, certificate of good moral character, and certificate that the parent is a bonafide member of a labor organization and workers organization.
