

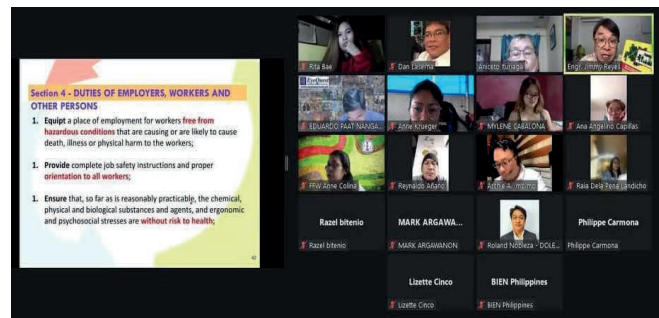
SIX BATCHES OF BOSH TRAININGS CONDUCTED UNDER WODP

Six batches of online Basic Occupational Safety and Health (BOSH) trainings were conducted from September to December 2021. The Federation of Free Workers (FFW), and the Philippine Trade and General Workers Organization (PTGWO), who availed the Training Grants provided under the Workers Organization Development Program (WODP), coordinated the trainings. The WODP is a program facilitated by the Bureau of Labor Relations (BLR) that aims to empower the workers by providing them accessible information facilities, as well as training, educational and technical assistance.



The PTGWO organized four batches of online BOSH trainings held on September 25, October 16, October 23, and November 13, 2021, in which more than 170 workers benefitted. The FFW, on the other hand, conducted two batches of online BOSH trainings on October 16 and November 27, 2021, participated by more than 50 workers.

The BOSH trainings were composed of seven modules which include: (1) Introduction to occupational safety and health; (2) Understanding occupational safety and health; (3) Identifying hazards and how to eliminate them; (4) Application of Hazards Identification, Risk Assessment and Control (HIRAC); (5) Workplace emergency preparedness; (6) Compliance to administrative occupational safety and health requirements; and (7) Trainers' training. These modules allowed the workers to realize the importance of occupational safety and health in the workplace. It equipped them with appropriate knowledge and skills to identify potential hazards in the workplace and to control or prevent them from posing any danger to workers. The workers who participated in the training were now certified Safety Officers 1 (SO1), which gave them added advantage in their workplaces where occupational safety and health is the most important.
